Greetings MCPA members,

Welcome to Spring/Summer 2019! The warm season is here and as you may already know, the Mountain Loop Highway is fully opened as of May 10. WTA reports for the Monte Cristo Townsite have already appeared and word is snow is entirely melted out of the area. Along with this comes reports of an early start on the growing season, meaning plenty of trail and maintenance work ahead. On the plus side, the old county roadway appears to have survived without reportable damage, so Townsite access is just a short hike or bike ride away from Barlow.

It is with sadness that we received word of the passing of longtime MCPA member and friend Forrest Johanson on April 5. Forrest was extremely knowledgeable in 19th century mining industry technology, and spent much of his life visiting and researching mining sites, providing significant content for Daryl Jacobson's Northwest Underground Explorations' "Discovering Washington's Historic Mines Volume 1". Daryl provided this brief memorial:

Forrest Johanson spent most of his adult life collecting historical documents, photographs and artifacts regarding the history of mining and Snohomish and King counties. He spent countless hours in libraries, museums and universities pouring over information and photo copying thousands of pages of documents. He bought books and more books, spending his meager funds, not on cars, fancy clothes, vacations or movies, but on history.

Forrest knew the importance of our heritage.

Forest knew our true heritage could be lost if someone didn't save it.

Forest knew our perception of history can be clouded with time and carelessness if we don't preserve it.

Forrest knew his work with local history groups and organizations was his calling and he took it very seriously.

I first met Forrest Johanson in the mid-1980s when I was introduced to him by Enid Nordund. I told Forrest I was in the early stages of researching information for a couple books: A book about Snohomish County mines and another about the Everett and Monte Cristo Railway.

Forrest almost immediately jumped in and offered his full 100% support. This gracious man allowed me to copy thousands of pages of documents, maps and pictures he had collected over the years. He took us on several tours of King County mining areas prompting us to include King County mines in our book.

Forrest knew you don't write history books for profit. You do it for the love of researching, interpreting and preserving history.

Forrest was very positive that he did not want his name mentioned in any way. That was his choice. Sadly we agreed.

Forrest Johanson's gift to us will live on through the decades.

I believe all of us here are very proud of Forrest and indebted to him for his life's work.
